This scholarship helps people who are part of The Legion Family pursue a college degree later in life or allow them to pick up where they left off when their studies were interrupted. If you're at this place in life, this may be the right scholarship for you. Applicant must be a member of The American Legion, American Legion Auxiliary, or Sons of The American Legion and shall have paid dues for the two preceding years and for the calendar year in which application is made and must be either a non-traditional student returning to the classroom after some period of time in which his/her formal education was interrupted or a non-traditional student who is just beginning his/her education at a later point in life. American Legion Auxiliary Spirit of Youth Scholarship recipients are not eligible. For more information or to apply, please visit the scholarship provider's website.

Spouses, dependent children, and grandchildren of blinded veterans are eligible for the annual Kathern F. Gruber Scholarship to assist them with their higher education tuition. Gruber scholarships are for one year only but recipients can re-apply and receive the award up to four times. The blinded veteran family member is not required to be a BVA member for the spouse or child to receive a scholarship. To further the Objectives of the Order of Daedalians insofar as assisting in the education of deserving young persons in the field of aerospace engineering and flight, and encouraging those young people who receive valuable aerospace training to pursue a military career, the Daedalian Foundation has established a Descendants Scholarship Program for descendants of Daedalian members. The Foundation will award scholarships annually to eligible students nominated by Daedalian Flights or submitted directly by the descendant and to the Scholarship Committee of the Daedalian Foundation. Additional awards may be made based upon availability of resources.

The Daughters of the Cincinnati have contributed generously to the scholarship fund for over a century. Applicants must be daughters of career commissioned officers in the United States military. If you are eligible, you must apply during your senior year in high school. The application process includes an essay, secondary school report, a letter of recommendation from a member of the applicant's community, and a Student Aid Report (SAR). The Daughters of Union Veterans of the Civil War (duvs) Scholarship is awarded to a deserving member to assist with her education at the post-secondary level. Members may apply for funding during their senior year in high school. The applicant must have been active as a duv for a minimum of two consecutive years. The applicant must have and maintain a satisfactory scholastic standing. For more information or to apply, please visit the scholarship provider's website.

Dependent unmarried children under age 21 (23 if enrolled as a full-time student) of active duty personnel, reserve/guard or retired military members, or survivors of deceased members, may apply for this scholarship. Dependent children of NOAA (National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration), Public Health Service, other federal or military related agencies or active or DoD civilian employees are not eligible unless they meet the above requirement.

The Mary Rowena Cooper Scholarship is for students seeking degrees, certificates, or diplomas at vocational/technical schools, colleges, or universities. Award amounts vary and are based on financial need. Student must have a minimum 2.0 GPA and be a child of a living or deceased veteran who served in Vietnam who are enrolled in a minimum of six credit hours/semester during the academic year. The Military Child of the Year Award recognizes outstanding military children who demonstrate resiliency, leadership, and achievement in their communities. Recipients, along with a parent or guardian, travel to Washington, D.C., for a special recognition Gala. They also receive a laptop computer and the \$10,000 award. We are excited to be able to offer recognition for children of National Guard, Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps and Coast Guard service members. Child must be a legal military dependent between the ages of 13 and 18 at the time of nomination. Status confirmed by Military ID or DEERS enrollment form. Child and one adult guardian must be available to travel to the Washington, DC area for the Gala award presentation. The purpose of the NEHA/AAS Scholarship program is to encourage early commitment by students to a career in and to stimulate past and present graduates to pursue postgraduate studies in EH sciences and/or public health. The program offers financial assistance to individuals with a demonstrable need, and serves to introduce adequately trained professionals into the EH workforce.

Two awards are given to full-time students, one male and one female. Recipient must be either a single female, head of household student with dependents; a single male, head of household with dependents; or a Vietnam veteran who no longer has access to educational benefits and has a GPA of at least 3.0. Student must be a custodial parent and must demonstrate financial need.

ProVets is an independent organization whose primary purpose is to provide financial help to veterans and their families needing professional and/or academic assistance through grants and scholarships. Applicants must be a U.S. citizen, rank in the upper 20% of their high school class and be admitted in an educational program. Must submit a detailed written request for scholarship along with three letters of recommendation. For more information or to apply, please visit the scholarship provider's website.

Higher education is expensive and can run into the tens of thousands of dollars per year. The Montgomery G.I. Bill and the Post 9/11 G.I. Bill both provide a strong foundation for educational finance, but even these solid tools often fall short of footing the bill. This scholarship program provides financial support to service men and women who have been awarded the Purple Heart and are college-bound. A minimum 2.5 GPA is also required. Applicants must also write a 1,200-1,500 essay. For more information or to apply, please visit the scholarship provider's website.

The scholarship assists with academic expenses, including tuition and fees, books, and living expenses for U.S. veterans and active duty service members of all branches of the U.S. Military including the National Guard and Reserve. Current spouses of veterans or active-duty service members (including surviving spouses) are also eligible.

The Wings Over America Scholarship Foundation is sponsoring scholarships to further the post-secondary education of deserving students. Last year, this foundation assisted 50 deserving dependents. Scholarships are to be used only for tuition and tuition based fees charged by the college for A.A, A.S., B.A, B.S. or technical certification. This is for undergraduate work only.

The Women's Army Corps Veterans Association Scholarship has been established to recognize relatives of Army Service Women. Students must be a U.S. citizen and a high school graduating senior with a minimum 3.5 GPA. For more information or to apply please visit the scholarship provider's website.

Women's Overseas Service League scholarship assistance may be granted to women who are committed to advancement in military or other public service careers, have demonstrated such commitment through life experiences and have successfully completed a minimum of 12 semester or 18 quarter hours of study in any institution of higher education in a program leading to an academic degree, associate degree or higher. The program may be professional or technical in nature; agree to enroll for a minimum of six semester or nine quarter hours of study each academic period; agree to maintain academic standards.

Applications and associated documentation must be postmarked no later than March 1st for consideration for the following academic year. Awards may be renewed for a second year. For more information or to apply, please visit the scholarship provider's website.

Applicants must be a citizen of the United States of America, resident of MA, VT, RI, ME, CT or NH. Must be the natural or legally adopted child or a U.S. Service member who received an honorable discharge from any branch of service of the US Armed Forces and must be a primary or secondary school student; or undergraduate or graduate student at a college or university who is pursuing studies or conducting research to meet the requirements for an academic or professional degree; or student - whether full-time or part-time - who studies at an educational institution that provides an educational program. Scholarship recipient must agree to authorize the Warrior Thunder Foundation to publicize your scholarship award if you are selected. Priority will be given to those dependents whose parent/guardian served for eight or more years; or has either had a parent die while serving on or in an active duty status; or a parent that has been classified as a wounded warrior through the Air Force Wounded Warrior program. Additional funds supporting this program have been contributed by family, friends and colleagues.

The American Legion Auxiliary annually provides one Junior member in each of the five American Legion Auxiliary divisions with a scholarship. The applicant must have held membership in the American Legion Auxiliary for the immediate past three years and must hold a membership card for the current year; and must continue to maintain membership throughout the four-year scholarship period. Scholarship monies are dispersed directly to the four-year accredited college or university, per the recipient's direction, and may be used for tuition, books, fees and other appropriate expenses. Applicant must be in their senior year of high school. For more information or to apply, please visit the scholarship provider's website.

Candidates for the American Legion Auxiliary Children of Warriors National Presidents' Scholarship shall be direct descendant veterans who served in the Armed Forces during eligibility dates for membership in The American Legion. Applicant must complete 50 hours of community service during his/her high school years and must be a senior in high school at the time of application. To further the Objectives of the Order of Daedalians insofar as assisting in the education of deserving young persons in the field of aerospace engineering and flight, and encouraging those young people who receive valuable aerospace training to pursue a military career, the Daedalian Foundation has established a Descendants Scholarship Program for descendants of Daedalian members.

The Daughters of the Cincinnati have contributed generously to the scholarship fund for over a century. Applicants must be daughters of career commissioned officers in the United States military. If you are eligible, you must apply during your senior year in high school. The application process includes an essay, secondary school report, a letter of recommendation from a member of the applicant's [...]

The Daughters of Union Veterans of the Civil War (duvs) Scholarship is awarded to a deserving member to assist with her education at the post-secondary level. Members may apply for funding during their senior year in high school. The applicant must have been active as a duv for a minimum of two consecutive years. The applicant must have and maintain a satisfactory scholastic standing.

Dependent unmarried children under age 21 (23 if enrolled as a full-time student) of active duty personnel, reserve/guard and retired military members, or survivors of deceased members, may apply for this scholarship. Dependent children of NOAA (National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration), Public Health Service, other federal or military related agencies or active or DoD civilian

The Mary Rowena Cooper Scholarship is for students seeking degrees, certificates, or diplomas at vocational/technical schools, colleges, or universities. Award amounts vary and are based on financial need. Students must have a minimum 2.0 GPA and be a child of a living or deceased veteran who served in Vietnam who are enrolled in a minimum of six credit hours/semester during the academic year.

The Military Child of the Year Award recognizes outstanding military children who demonstrate resiliency, leadership, and achievement in their communities. Recipients, along with a parent or guardian, travel to Washington, D.C., for a special recognition Gala. They also receive a laptop computer and the \$10,000 award. We are excited to be able to offer recognition children of National Guard, [...]

The purpose of the NEHA/AAS Scholarship program is to encourage early commitment by students to a career in EH and to stimulate past and present graduates to pursue postgraduate studies in EH sciences and/or public health. The program offers financial assistance to individuals with a demonstratable need, and serves to introduce adequately trained professionals into EH [...]

Two awards are given to full-time students, one male and one female. Recipient must be either a single female, head-of-household student with dependents; a single male, head of household with dependents; or a Vietnam veteran who no longer has access to educational benefits and has a GPA of at least 3.0. Student must be a custodial parent and must demonstrate financial need.

ProVets is as an independent organization whose primary purpose is to provide financial help to veterans and their families needing professional and/or academic assistance through grants and scholarships. Higher education is expensive and can run into the tens of thousands of dollars per year. The Montgomery G.I. Bill and the 9/11 G.I. Bill both provide a strong foundation for educational finance, but even these solid tools often fall short of footing the bill. This scholarship program provides financial support to service men and women who have been awarded the Purple Heart and are [...]

The scholarship assists with academic expenses, including tuition and fees, books, and living expenses for U.S. veterans and active duty service members of all branches of the U.S. Military including the National Guard and Reserve. Current spouses of veterans or active-duty service members (including surviving spouses) are also eligible.

The Wings Over America Scholarship Foundation is sponsoring scholarships to further the post-secondary education of deserving students. Last year, this foundation assisted 50 deserving dependents. Scholarships are to be used only for tuition and tuition based fees charged by the college for A.A, A.S., B.A, B.S. or technical certification. This is for undergraduate work only.

The Women's Army Corps Veterans Association Scholarship has been established to recognize relatives of Army Service Women. Students must be a U.S. citizen and a high school graduating senior with a minimum 3.5 GPA. For more information or to apply please visit the scholarship provider's website. [...]

Women's Overseas Service League scholarship assistance may be granted to women who are committed to advancement in military or other public service careers, have demonstrated such commitment through life experiences and have successfully completed a minimum of 12 semester or 18 quarter hours of study in any institution of higher education in a program leading to an academic degree, associate [...]

The goal of the Warrior Thunder (TJX) Scholarship Fund is to assist a veteran's child in their educational desires to serve their nation or community and/or to provide assistance to our military or Veterans. It is a one-time, \$1,000 scholarship to cover tuition, room, board, books, and supplies. The funds may be used for any term, including the summer term, during the award academic school [...]

The AMVET National Scholarship Program is designed for those veterans who have exhausted the resources of the G.I. Bill. Applicants must have been honorably discharged, and must be attending an accredited college, university or technical school.

The Military Order of the Purple Heart Scholarship is available to all veterans who have been awarded the Purple Heart. The program is also open to widows and dependents of those service-members who have been awarded the Purple Heart posthumously.

The American Legion Scholarship is available to all veteran members of the legion who are pursuing their undergraduate studies at an accredited college or university.

This program was made possible by a bequest from Mr. and Mrs. Michael and Judith Burgstein in memory of their devoted son and AFA lifetime member, Colonel Aaron Burgstein. Family, friends, and colleagues have contributed additional funds.

The Colonel Aaron Burgstein Memorial Scholarship was established to aid minor dependents of (officer or enlisted) Active Duty veteran, or retired service members; reservists; or National Guard members of all branches pursuing a degree at an accredited college or university. Priority is given to dependents whose parent or guardian served for eight or more years, who have had a parent die while serving on Active Duty, or who have a parent classified as a wounded warrior through the Air Force Wounded Warrior program. Awarded Annually

Two scholarships annually to encourage Air Force spouses worldwide to pursue associate/bachelor undergraduate or graduate/postgraduate degrees.

This scholarship is made possible by a bequest from the estate of Lt. Col. Romeo and Josephine Bass Ferretti, and was established for minor dependents of Air Force Active Duty, Reserve, or Air National Guard enlisted Airmen pursuing an undergraduate STEM degree. Awarded annually to a student based upon several factors, including academics, character, and financial need.

This scholarship was made possible by a bequest from Mrs. Elizabeth L. Lindsay, widow of Lt. Col. John Lindsay, in memory of their children John C. and Blanche Lee Lindsay who passed away before Lt. Col. and Mrs. Lindsay. Awarded annually to one child of members of the United States Air Force who are pursuing a college degree.

This program provides scholarships and grants to military spouses, military dependents, and transitioning service members for the advancement of oral health and wellness. Eligible applicants may be pursuing a wide range of programs such as dental nursing, home healthcare aid, or caregiver training. Awarded to five eligible applicants

The Scholarship Foundation guarantees scholarships of \$30,000 over four years (\$7,500 a year) to eligible* children of the following:

The Scholarship Foundation provides scholarship support of \$6,000 to \$40,000 over four years (\$1,500 – \$10,000) to eligible children of the following:

The Society's Education Assistance Program offers interest-free loans and grants for undergraduate/post-secondary education at an accredited 2- or 4-year education, technical or vocational institution in the United States. This financial assistance is available for children of active duty, retired or deceased Sailors and Marines; and for spouses of active duty and retired Sailors and Marines.

Eligibility Requirements --

Applicants MUST be one of the following:

- child (under age 23 on May 1, 2019) of an active duty, retired or deceased Sailor or Marine
- spouse of an active duty or retired Sailor or Marine
- MECEP/MECP student

And all students MUST be:

- Registered in DEERS (Defense Eligibility Enrollment Reporting System)
- Enrolled, or planning to enroll, as a full-time student for the entire year (Aug-May) at the same institution and pursuing an undergraduate degree at a post-secondary, technical, or vocational institution that is:

Each year, seven AMVETS Scholarships are awarded for up to \$4,000 each to active duty military personnel, honorably discharged veterans, reserves, spouses, and children or grandchildren who demonstrate financial need for tuition assistance afford enrollment into any accredited degree program. Eligible candidates must have a high school diploma or GED equivalent, be U.S. citizens, provide evidence of active duty or veteran status, and not be in default on any federal student loans.

Annually, the Chief Petty Officer Scholarship Fund offers up to 60 scholarships for \$2,000 each to improve access to educational opportunities for dependent children, adopted children, step-children, and non-uniformed spouses of an active duty or veteran Chief, Senior Chief, or Master Chief Petty Officer of the U.S. Navy. In order to qualify for the funding, applicants must be graduating high school seniors or high school graduates, be accepted or currently enrolled in an accredited undergraduate institution, and submit three letters of recommendation.

On a competitive basis, the Dolphin Scholarship Fund provides up to 115 annual scholarships for \$3,400 to unmarried children or stepchildren under the age of 24 who are dependent on active duty members of the Navy's Submarine Force that have served submarine support activities for at least eight years. Selection for the renewable award is based on academic proficiency, demonstrated financial need for assistance, and commitment to involvement in extra-curricular school or community activities.

Funded through the generosity of the Defense Commissary Agency, the Fisher House Foundation awards several Scholarship Military Children for up to \$2,000 a piece to unmarried sons and daughters of active duty, reserve/guard, or retired military commissary customers who will be enrolled full-time in a four-year undergraduate degree program. Eligible applicants must be attending a U.S. accredited institution, be under 23 years old, and have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher.

In honor of the bravery exhibited by members of the U.S. Armed Forces, the Freedom Alliance Scholarship Fund awards up to \$25,000 to young Americans who are the dependent children of an active duty service member who was killed or permanently disabled as the result of an operational mission or training accident. Eligible applicants must be high school seniors or high school graduates who are currently enrolled or accepted for enrollment in any accredited U.S. institution of higher learning.

Administered by the Air Force Aid Society, the General George S. Brown Spouse Tuition Assistance Program (STAP) provides up to \$5,000 for selected spouses of active duty U.S. Air Force service members who are currently residing overseas. Eligible candidates must be legally married to a service member without separation or pending divorce, be a high school graduate currently enrolled as a full-time undergraduate student, maintain at least a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher, and demonstrate financial need.

Each year, the Hope for Warriors Foundation offers the Spouse/Caregiver Scholarships in recognition of military spouses and caregivers for their strength and resolve despite adversity as financial assistance for continuing education at an accredited U.S. institution. For consideration, it is required that applicants submit an application, certification form, proof of military injury or death, an original essay discussing academic achievement and personal goals, two-page questionnaire, and two letters of recommendation.

Named for Lieutenant General Clarence L. Huebner who commanded the Big Red One during World War II, the Society of the 1st Infantry Division provides the Huebner Scholarships for high school seniors who are the children or grandchildren of soldiers who have served in the 1st Infantry Division of the U.S. Army. In order to be eligible for the \$10,000 award in four annual installments of \$2,500, individuals must submit a transcript, 200-word essay, college acceptance letter, proof of military service, and two letters of recommendation.

Sponsored by the National Military Family Association, the Joanne Holbrook Patton Military Spouse Scholarships award up to \$5,000 to spouses of all active duty, national guard or reserve, and retired uniformed services members for use in attending vocational training and degree-seeking undergraduate or graduate programs. In order to qualify for the funding, military spouses must provide a copy of their marriage certificate, a military verification document, and a signed scholarship agreement form.

Annually, the Ladies Auxiliary of the Fleet Reserve Association (LA FRA) presents \$5,000 scholarships to deserving male and female students who are striving to reach their professional goals by pursuing an undergraduate or graduate degree from an accredited U.S. institution. In order to be eligible for this award, applicants must be the sons, daughters, grandsons, or granddaughters of military members of the FRA or the LA FRA.

Established in 1948 on the principle that "education is the cornerstone of a strong democracy," the Military Officers Association of America (MOAA) Scholarship Fund provides grants of varying amounts for students who are the children of currently serving, former, or retired commissioned or warrant officers. In order to receive up to five years of undergraduate funding, eligible candidates must be enrolled at an accredited U.S. institution, be under the age of 24 years old, and remain in good academic standing.

Sponsored by the Financial Industry Regulatory Authority (FINRA) Investor Education Foundation, the Military Spouse FINRA Fellowship Program covers the cost of paying certification fees and provides a monthly stipend to military spouses who participate in a training program to get on the right track to becoming an Accredited Financial Counselor (AFC). Fellows in the program will receive the marketable job skills, knowledge, tools, and resources needed to overcome their military family's financial struggles.

As a program devised to provide some financial reprieve to assist wounded military members and their families with reaching their post-secondary educational goals, the Paralyzed Veterans of America Scholarships are awarded for \$3,000 to paralyzed veterans members, their spouses, and their unmarried dependent children under 24 years old. Qualified candidates must be U.S. citizens, be accepted or currently enrolled as a full-time or part-time student in an accredited institution, and maintain good academic progress.

The Society of Daughters of the United States Army presents annual \$1,000 scholarships to the daughters or granddaughter of a career warrant or commissioned officer of the U.S. Army who is currently on active duty, retired from active duty after at least 20 years of service, or died while on active duty. Eligible female full-time undergraduate students must be enrolled in any accredited post-secondary U.S. institution, have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher, and submit a personal statement showcasing patriotism.

Each year, the Tailhook Educational Foundation offers scholarships for up to \$22,000 to high school graduates who are the natural, step, or adopted child or grandchild of a current or former Naval or Marine Corps Aviator, Flight Officer, or Air crew member. Eligible applicants must be related to a service member who is serving or has served on board a U.S. Navy Aircraft Carrier, be accepted for undergraduate enrollment at an accredited U.S. institution, and demonstrate financial need.

Annually, the Wings over America Foundation provides college scholarships for up to \$5,000 to dependent children and spouses of all U.S. Navy personnel who are serving in active duty, retired, honorably discharged, or deceased. Qualified candidates must be the natural born child or legal spouse of any officer or enlisted who served within Naval Air Forces for consideration. Recipients will be selected based on scholastic merit, financial need, and community service involvement.

If you are a child of an active duty, retired, or active reserve Coast Guard member you are eligible to apply. Successful applicants can expect awards ranging between \$1,000 to \$5,000. This award is intended to assist non-military spouses of Enlisted Coast Guard members in ranks E3-E6 studying at a nationally or regionally accredited institution with the award covering expenses like books, school fees, transportation, and child care costs. Thanks to the generous support of Delta Dental, the Coast Guard Foundation can assist non-military spouses of Enlisted Coast Guard members in ranks E3 - E6 pursuing a degree or certification related to oral health and wellness. There are 10 scholarships available in the amount of \$2,000 and are limited to one payment per calendar year. Scholarships will be awarded in the order in which they are received, provided all eligibility requirements have been met.

Our assistance helps to make up the difference to pay for things like books, lab fees, and technical equipment opening the doors of opportunity to so many Coast Guard families. Expensive textbooks and other out-of-pocket fees can put a college degree out of reach for many Coast Guard families, especially those who are supporting children.

We award scholarships based not only on an applicant's financial need, but also on scholastic promise, motivation, moral character, good citizenship and leadership qualities.

This application is intended for qualified active duty Coast Guard, civil service employee personnel or their dependents at the Coast Guard Aviation Logistic Center. The scholarship will be used for preparatory, collegiate, postgraduate, professional and vocational education, formal or informal training which develops the talents and potential of the beneficiary.

The Coast Guard Exchange System Scholarship Program, for dependent children entering college, provides one-time scholarship of \$1,500 to the most favorably evaluated applicant, \$750 to the second-ranked, and \$500 to the third. Criteria considered in evaluation include academics, accomplishments and hobbies, and demonstrated leadership potential. The following documents must be submitted with an application: transcript, essay describing one's personal goals, and two reference letters.

Accessible to all dependent children, age 24 and under, and all spouses of Active-Duty U.S. military Service Members are eligible to apply for scholarships with ThanksUSA

Provides \$2,000 to students pursuing an undergraduate or graduate degree while employed in the science or technology disciplines directly related to the mission of AFCEA.

Administered by the Air Force Aid Society that provides tuition assistance to the spouses of active-duty U.S. Air Force service members residing overseas

– Provides \$2,000 grants to selected sons and daughters of active duty, Title 10 AGR/Reserve, Title 32 AGR performing full-time active duty, retired, retired reserve and deceased Air Force members; spouses (stateside) of active duty members and Title AGR/Reservists; and surviving spouses of deceased personnel for their undergraduate studies.

Available for children or legally adopted children of active duty U.S. military and Guard, and Reserve personnel who were federalized and died on active duty on or after September 11, 2001.

American Legion Auxiliary Scholarship for Non-Traditional Students. Available to current dues paying (for past two years) member of the American Legion, Auxiliary, or Sons of The American Legion who is a student who has had at least one year of college and is in need of financial assistance to pursue an undergraduate degree

Established to provide college education and welfare assistance to the surviving children of military heroes who have already given their lives in patriotic service to their country fighting our nation's war against terrorism as part of Operation Enduring Freedom in Afghanistan and the Philippines, Operation Iraqi Freedom or future conflicts.

Annually awards scholarships to Veterans/active military, their sons, daughters or grandchildren. A son, daughter or grandchild of a deceased Veteran is also eligible.

Scholarships of \$1,000 each are offered to Military Veterans or immediate family members and Disabled Veterans. These scholarships differ from most others as the veteran can choose between trade/vocational schools, 2 year or 4 year university

Offered to college-bound military children at installations served by a commissary. Open to qualified sons and daughters of military ID card holders to include active duty members, Reserve and Guard members, and retirees.

For college-level education of members of the AAAA, and the spouses, unmarried siblings, unmarried children and unmarried grandchildren of current and deceased AAAA members.

The MG James Ursano Scholarship program is for dependent children of Service Members on federal active duty, retired, or deceased while in active or retired status.

To provide spouses of active duty and retired Service Members and widows(ers) of Service Members who died either on active duty or in a retired status, and residing in the U.S. with need-based financial assistance in pursuing educational goals.

One-year financial scholarships awarded on the basis of academic record and participation in school and community activities.

The Army Women's Foundation recognizes the importance of education and the role it plays in personal, professional and economic fulfillment. The Army Women's Foundation Legacy Scholarship Program provides grants to women soldiers, past and present, and their lineal descendants to help them attain their educational goals. Can be applied to schooling now or held back. Folds of Honor on behalf of young children until needed at the time of enrollment.

Students are eligible if they are the dependent child of an active duty Service Member who was killed or permanently disabled (100%) rating as the result of an operational mission or training accident, or who is currently certified as POW or MIA

Open to dependent unmarried children under age 23 of those who have died or have become disabled through their active military service on or after September 11, 2001.

A student who is not eligible for a Pell Grant but whose parent or guardian was a member of the U.S. Armed Forces and died as a result of service performed in Iraq or Afghanistan after September 11, 2001 may be eligible to receive the Iraq and Afghanistan Service Grant. Enrolled in college at least part-time at the time of the parent's or guardian's death.

Administered by the National Military Family Association (NMFA). Fisher House Foundation contributes \$100,000 to the NMFA in order to expand the number of scholarship grants awarded each year

Available to dependents of members in good standing of the Chief Warrant Officers Association. Additional Information <http://www.cwoauscg.org/scholarship.htm>

Each year we offer a \$1,000 scholarship to a military veteran or immediate family member to help him/her receive the training needed for their chosen civilian career.

Assistance primarily rendered to children of Marines or Federal law enforcement personnel who were killed on duty or died under extraordinary circumstances while serving our country at home or abroad. These funds enable us to provide these children with scholarships for their higher education. When a child of a United States Marine is afflicted with a physical or mental disability and requires special medical equipment or tutoring, our Foundation may grant financial assistance to that child's family if their personal insurance does not cover the complete cost of treatment for this child.

NGEF, DRS Technologies Create College Scholarship For Children of Fallen National Guardsmen: The National Guard Educational Foundation (NGEF) created a college scholarship fund for the children of more than 650 National Guardsmen killed in the war on terrorism. DRS Technologies, Inc. of Parsippany, N.J., will provide up to \$6,250 per year to selected students attending a four-year institution or a two-year program at a community college or technical school. "The DRS Guardian Scholarship Fund is open to any high school or college student who is a son or daughter of a Guardsman killed in an operational or training mission in support of operations Enduring Freedom, Iraqi Freedom or New Dawn

NMFA Awarded only to military ID-carrying Uniformed Services' spouses (active duty, retiree, Reserve, National Guard, and) and survivors

Awarded to spouses of Uniformed Services members (active duty, National Guard and Reserve, retirees, and survivors) to obtain professional certification or to attend post secondary or graduate school.

The Scholarships for Children and Spouses of Deceased or Disabled Veterans and Service Members (CSDDV) provides scholarships for dependent children or un-remarried spouses of Florida Veterans or Service Members who died as a result of service-connected injuries, diseases, or disabilities sustained while on active duty or who have been certified by the Florida Department of Veterans Affairs as having service connected 100% permanent and total disabilities. CSDDV also provides funding for dependent children whose parent is classified as a prisoner of war or missing in action by the Armed Forces of the United States or as civilian personnel captured while serving with the consent or authorization of the United States Government during wartime service. CSDDV provides funding for tuition and registration fees at an eligible postsecondary institution or the equivalent at an eligible private postsecondary institution in Florida.

The Scholarships for Military Children Program was created to recognize the contributions of military Families to the readiness of the fighting force and to celebrate the role of the commissary in the military Family community. The VFW's Military Scholarship program provides 25 \$3,000 scholarships annually to VFW members who are currently serving in uniform or have been discharged within the 36 months before the December 31 deadline.

Allied Van Lines just launched a new military scholarship program to help students further their education. Annually, two recipients will be awarded 1,000 dollars towards their education. This scholarship is for military logistics/supply chain management and operational management majors as well as equivalent majors such as business, business operations management, and other like majors.

Eligibility Requirements:

- U.S. Citizen (or permanent resident).
- Enrolled (or enrolling) as full-time student of accredited college/university within the United States for completion of undergraduate degree in Logistics or equivalent field.
- Applicants must be one of the following below:
 1. An honorably discharged veteran or current member of the active military (including National Guard and Reserves).
 2. A spouse of a current military service member or honorably discharged veteran.
 3. A child (under age 21 or full-time student under age 23) of a current military service member or honorably discharged veteran.

AMVETS National Service Foundation annually awards scholarships to veterans/active military, their sons, daughters or grandchildren. A son, daughter, or grandchild of a deceased veteran is also eligible. Awarded on the basis of academic excellence and financial need, the scholarships go to deserving high school seniors, high school JROTC students, and veterans pursuing higher education. The following scholarships are awarded annually:

AMVETS National Service Foundation Scholarships

- Six scholarships for high school seniors
- Three scholarships for veterans
- One scholarship for a JROTC high school senior entering any undergraduate programs

The American Legion offers a number of scholarships and other resources to assist young people in their pursuit of higher education. There are opportunities for everyone, including kin of wartime veterans and participants in Legion programs. The BVA awards the Kathern F. Gruber Scholarship and Thomas H. Miller Awards Spouses to dependent children of blinded veterans to assist them with their higher education tuition. The scholarships are awarded on the basis of merit through an application process that is evaluated by a committee. The blinded veteran family member is not required to be a BVA member for the spouse or child to receive a scholarship.

BVAA awards two Renee Feldman scholarships. The scholarships are open to the spouses and children of blinded veterans and a membership in BVA is not required. To be eligible for a Feldman scholarship, the applicant must have been accepted at the school of his/her choice. The institution in question may be a vocational school, community college, four-year college, or university.

Children of Fallen Patriots Foundation provides college scholarships to the children of Soldiers, Sailors, Airmen, and Marines died in combat or in training. Scholarships awarded based on need, and intended to supplement other public and private sources of funding to cover tuition, room and board, or books at any accredited college or university. Amounts based on individual needs and available funding.

Daughters of the Cincinnati Scholarship applicants must be high school senior and daughter of a career officer commissioned in the regular Army, Navy, Air Force, Coast Guard, or Marine Corp (active, retired, or deceased). When requesting application, provide: year in high school, qualifying parent's rank, and branch of service.

Disabled American Veterans (DAV) Auxiliary supports the National Education Loan Fund which provides interest-free loans to members of the DAV Auxiliary who are furthering their education at a college, university, or vocational school. The organization has developed an education scholarship program for life members of the DAV Auxiliary who are continuing their education at college, university, or vocational school.

The Scholarships for Military Children Program was created in recognition of the contributions of military families to the readiness of the fighting force and to celebrate the role of the commissary in the military family community. It is the intent of the program that a scholarship funded through contributions be awarded annually for each commissary operated by the Defense Commissary Agency worldwide.

The mission of this education and professional support scholarship program is to help prepare military spouses for meaningful employment and to better contribute to their family's financial security.

The "Heroes' Legacy Scholarships" program honors not only those who have fallen in battle, but all who have died or have become disabled through their active military service since September 11, 2001. The program is open to their dependent unmarried children under age 23. A disability is defined as one that results in the service member being eligible for, and receiving, Traumatic Service members' Group Life Insurance (TSGLI) or a permanent and total disability compensation rating of 100%.

The Fund has awarded scholarships to sons and daughters of American heroes in the last several years. The Fund honors the bravery and dedication exhibited by Americans in our Armed Forces who have sacrificed life or limb defending our country by providing educational scholarships to their children. Applicant must be a high school senior, a high school graduate, or enrolled in an institution of higher learning, including colleges, universities, or vocational schools.

Francis P. Matthews and John E. Swift Educational Trust Fund to provide scholarships for dependent children of a member in good standing who died or became permanently and totally disabled as a result of Military service during a time of conflict. Military Officers Association of America (MOAA) Scholarship Fund provides educational assistance for children of military families. It is based on one of the Association's founding principles that "education is the cornerstone of a strong Democracy" for students (under age 24) who are children of an active-duty, reserve, or National Guard parent who died on active service. Surviving spouse's membership in MOAA is required for consideration where applicable. Military academy cadets are not eligible for this program.

MOAA grants are limited to children of the surviving spouse of retired officers. A student cannot receive both a MOAA loan and a Ratay Grant.

MOAA offers interest-free loans, renewable annually for up to five years of full-time undergraduate study. Assistance available only to students who have not yet earned an undergraduate degree.

Military Order of the Purple Heart annually offers scholarships. To be eligible to receive a MOPH scholarship, applicant must

- Recipient of the Purple Heart, or
- Direct descendant (child, step-child, adopted child, grandchild, or great grandchild) of a member of the MOPH, or
- Direct descendant (child, step-child, adopted child, grandchild, or great grandchild) of a veteran killed in action, or a veteran who died of wounds, but did not have the opportunity to join the MOPH, or
- Spouse or widow of a recipient of the Purple Heart, a veteran killed in action, or a veteran who died of wounds.
- Applicants must also be U.S. citizen, graduate or upcoming graduate of an accredited high school, have 2.75 GPA, and be accepted or enrolled as a full-time student at a college, university, or trade school at time scholarship is awarded.

Red River Valley Fighter Pilots Association administers a scholarship made annually to enrolled eligible students, of accredited colleges, universities, technical schools, and career institutions.

Eligibility:

- Kinship Requirement: Scholarship recipients must be immediate dependent (legal son, daughter, or spouse) of a U.S. aircrew member listed as KIA or MIA from any combat situation involving U.S. Military from August 1964 (Vietnam Era) through the present; or Military aircrew member killed as the result of performing aircrew duties during a non-combat mission; or a RRVA member currently in good standing or was in good standing at time of death.
- Kinship Not Required: To provide educational assistance to individuals in fields related to aviation and space (Kinship to deceased aviator not required). Selections based on financial need, demonstrated academic achievement, college entrance examinations, and accomplishments in school, church, civic, and social activities. Scholarships cover tuition, fees, books, and room and board. The scholarship award will be an amount determined by the student's demonstrated need, available funds and priorities established by the RRVA and administered by the Scholarship Committee.

Special Operations Warrior Foundation (SOWF) provides college educations to surviving children of fallen Army, Navy, Air Force and Marine Corps special operations personnel who lose their lives in combat or training. SOWF provides for, or identifies funding, to cover the full costs of a public college education: tuition, fees, room, board, books, and supplies. Scholarships offered are all grants, not loans, and can be used in private universities, state or community colleges, and vocational-technical training and career institutions.

Thanks USA® Scholarship Program plans to award 500 scholarships to dependent children, age 24 and under, and spouses of active-duty U.S. military service personnel (Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines, and Coast Guard). Recipients are selected based on financial need; academic record; demonstrated leadership and participation in school and community activities; and a goal statement. Preference will be given to children or spouses of service personnel killed or injured during active duty.

since its inception in 1942 has been committed to helping Air Force members and their families realize their academic goals. General Henry H. Arnold Education Grant Program provides need-based grants to full-time college undergraduates who are dependent children of active, Title 10 and Title 32 AGR, retired, and deceased Air Force members, spouses of active duty members, and surviving spouses of deceased Air Force members. Students must be full-time undergraduates and maintain a minimum 3.0 GPA.

General George S. Brown Spouse Tuition Assistance Program provides scholarships annually to help with tuition costs to spouses who have accompanied active duty members to their overseas assignments (includes AK and HI). Contact your local Family Support Center for application details and deadlines.

Lt Col Romeo and Josephine Bass Ferretti Scholarship This scholarship was established for minor dependents of Air Force active duty, Reserve or Air National Guard enlisted airmen pursuing an undergraduate degree in the area of science, technology, engineering or math (STEM). The recipients will be selected based upon high academic standards, good character and financial need.

Spouse Scholarships The Air Force Spouse Scholarship program is designed to encourage Air Force spouses worldwide to pursue associate/bachelor undergraduate or graduate/postgraduate degrees.

Air Force Sergeants Association (AFSA) and Airmen Memorial Foundation (AMF) Scholarship Program offer a scholarship program to financially assist the undergraduate studies of eligible, dependent children of the Total Air Force which includes Air Force Active Duty (AFAD), Air National Guard (ANG), and Air Force Reserve Command (AFRC) enlisted members in active duty, retired, or veteran status. Scholarships are awarded in each program based on the applicant's academic record, character, leadership skills, writing ability, versatility, and potential for success. Financial need is not a consideration.

More than 1,300 of these scholarships have been awarded.

Essay required.

Membership in this Association is not a condition precedent.

Applicant must be a high school senior or a college student in an accredited school or equivalent educational institution. Applicant must intend to work toward a BS or BA degree full time.

Naval Officers' Spouses' Association (NOSA) of Mayport Scholarship gives various awards to dependents of active duty or re Navy, Marine Corps, or Coast Guard service members who have served at least one tour of duty (or currently serve) at Nava Station Mayport or the former Naval Air Station Mayport.

provides grants for an academic year to children and unmarried spouses who are military dependents of deceased service members. Awards determined by NMCRS Headquarters Education Division.

is offered specifically to Navy and Marine Corps Divers, whether active duty or retired, and their eligible family members. The scholarship provides financial assistance for full-time undergraduate and graduate students, who must be participating in or the following areas of study: Oceanography, Ocean Agriculture, or Aquaculture.

provides interest-free loans to eligible spouses and children, under the age of 23, of active duty and retired (served 20 years) Sailors and Marine service members who reside within the United States. This program offers interest-free loans for an academic year.

offered to dependent children and spouses of active duty SEALs or SWCC (Special Warfare Combatant Crewmen) and other active duty military personnel currently serving in NSW commands

Dependent children of UDT-SEAL Association members who have served in or are currently serving in the U.S. Armed Forces the Naval Special Warfare community.

will be awarded based on merit and academic potential. Additionally, scholarships will be awarded solely for postsecondary education or training (e.g., trade, technical, vocational, and undergraduate college for dependent children and spouses. Description

The American Indian Nurse Scholarship Award Program was started by the NSCDA in 1927 to give students of American Indian descent the opportunity to pursue careers in nursing. The National Society of The Colonial Dames of America has provided a small number of scholarship awards to assist students of American Indian heritage who are pursuing degrees in nursing or in the field of health care and health education. Eligible students receive per semester and the money is to be used strictly for tuition, books or fees applicable to the student's approved program. The grant is sent to the school and credited to the student's account. Once a student is accepted, he or she may reapply for continued funds each semester as long as the student remains in academic good standing.

One of the Army Nurse Corps Association's major initiatives is the Scholarship Program. Its purpose is the support of nursing education through scholarship funding to worthy students who are US citizens in an accredited program in baccalaureate or graduate nursing, anesthesia, or related healthcare field.

What is HPSP? The Armed Forces Health Professions Scholarship Program is a program that will enable you to obtain a fully funded education in the fields of Medicine, Dentistry, Clinical Psychology, Physician Assistant, Podiatry or Optometry and a commission as a Naval Officer. In this program, 100% of your tuition, required school fees (excluding housing and meals), required books and equipment are paid. An approximately \$2,100 per month stipend is paid when in the program and not on Active Duty, and 45 days of Active Duty pay and benefits (as an Ensign/O-1) are awarded each year. The amount of Active Duty pay varies based on your marital status and prior military experience, but is generally in excess of \$4,500 for the period. In addition to these benefits, a \$20,000 signing bonus is paid to individuals signing up for the medical or dental HPSP programs. In return for these benefits, participants agree to serve on Active Duty, not in a training status, one year for every year of participation, with a minimum service obligation of 3 to 4 years on Active duty.

For future and current medical school students, the Health Professions Scholarship Program (HPSP) offers two-, three- and four-year military scholarships. The HPSP covers civilian medical school tuition, pays for fees, provides a monthly living stipend and includes a signing bonus under certain conditions. This scholarship is offered by the Army, Navy and Air Force, and the benefits are the same across all three Services. For those who hope to apply to HPSP, selection boards tend to look at all aspects of a person's application — leadership, extracurricular activities, fitness, grades and scores — so they can determine who will succeed in both medical school and the Military.

The Air Force offers scholarships for healthcare professionals to include: one- and two-year scholarships for Allied Health specialties (pharmacists, optometrists, clinical psychologists and public health officers), two- and three-year scholarships for nurse corps specialties and three- and four-year scholarships for medical corps and dental corps. These scholarships cover all tuition and required fees, including textbooks, small equipment items and supplies needed for study. You will also receive a monthly allowance for living expenses. While on scholarship, you will spend 45 days on active duty in the Air Force, and once you graduate, you will serve one year of active duty for each year of scholarship, serving a minimum of three years.

Funded by a grant from Delta Dental, this program provides scholarships and grants to military spouses, military dependents, and transitioning service members for the advancement of oral health and wellness. Eligible applicants may be pursuing a wide range of programs such as dentistry, nursing, home healthcare aid, or caregiver training. Five grants in the amount of \$2,000 each will be awarded.

Green to Gold Scholarships are awarded for two, three, or four years. Recipients will receive tuition or room and board support, additional money for textbooks, supplies, and equipment, and a monthly stipend for up to 10 months each school year. Additionally, there will be funding for attending the Leader Development and Assessment Course (LDAC) between the junior and senior years of college. If qualified, students may receive Montgomery G.I. Bill/Army College Fund (MGIB/ACF) benefit. The Society's Education Assistance Program offers interest-free loans and grants for undergraduate/post-secondary education at an accredited 2- or 4-year education, technical or vocational institution in the United States. This financial assistance is available for children of active duty, retired or deceased Sailors and Marines; and for spouses of active duty and retired Sailors and Marines.

Its purpose is to award grants to qualified applicants sponsored by WMA MEMBERS. These grants may be used at any accredited college, university or college level trade school.

This is a scholarship for children and grandchildren of Marines and former Marines (and of Navy Corpsmen who served with U.S. Marines). These are scholarships for higher education for deserving sons and daughters of United States Marines and children of former Marines, with particular attention being given to children whose parent was killed or wounded in action.

Each year, the Tailhook Educational Foundation offers scholarships for up to \$22,000 to high school graduates who are the natural, step, or adopted child or grandchild of a current or former Naval or Marine Corps Aviator, Flight Officer, or Air crewman. Eligible applicants must be related to a service member who is serving or has served on board a U.S. Navy Aircraft Carrier, be accepted for undergraduate enrollment at an accredited U.S. institution, and demonstrate financial need.

Monthly stipend given to a former enlisted Marine leaving the Marine Corps to attend a four-year institution. This award recognizes a Marine who has demonstrated exceptional courage and integrity in the face of great obstacles.

Assistance primarily rendered to children of Marines or Federal law enforcement personnel who were killed on duty or died under extraordinary circumstances while serving our country at home or abroad. These funds enable us to provide these children with scholarships for their higher education. When a child of a United States Marine is afflicted with a physical or mental disability and requires special medical equipment or tutoring, our Foundation may grant financial assistance to that Family if their personal insurance does not cover the complete cost of treatment for this child.

Navy Wives Club of America, Inc. (NWCA) Scholarship Foundation awards up to 30 scholarships annually.

Those eligible for the grants are the natural born, legally adopted, or stepson or daughter of an enlisted member of the Navy, Marine Corps, or Coast Guard on active duty, or retired with pay or the son or daughter of a deceased member of these categories. The grants may be used for tuition, room and board, fees and books. The following scholarships are offered. Visit website for details

1st Marine Division Association provides grants to assist dependents of deceased or 100% permanently disabled veterans of service with the 1st Marine Division in furthering their education toward a bachelor's degree. Grants are awarded to full time, undergraduate students attending an accredited college, university, or higher technical trade school, up to a maximum of four years. Payments are made directly to the educational institution.

2nd Marine Division Association only grants scholarships to unmarried sons, daughters, or grandchildren of individuals who are serving or have served with the 2nd Marine Division or unit attached. Applicants must reapply annually. Scholarships granted only to students who are high school seniors, graduates, or enrolled as undergraduates in an accredited college, university, or vocational/technical school.

3rd Marine Division Association Memorial Scholarship Fund was established in 1969, to honor the loss in Vietnam of Division Commander General Bruno A. Hochmuth. As a result, students of Third Marine Division Association members have consistently demonstrated excellence in colleges and universities across the United States. Grants for up to four years of undergraduate study only.

Fleet Reserve Association (FRA) Scholarship Program awards scholarships to FRA members, their spouses, children, and grandchildren. Awardees are selected based on financial need, academic standing, character, and leadership qualities

Ladies Auxiliary of the Fleet Reserve Association (LAFRA) offers scholarships based on financial need, scholarship proficiency, and character. Other factors being equal, preference will be given to an applicant who is a dependent of a member of the FRA and/or LA FRA. Recipients notified after July 1 for the year award it is provided.
