Academic **Scholarships**

Clarion University awards academic scholarships to students with a high school GPA above 3.0 and a combined SAT (critical reading and math) of 1000 or more or an ACT Composite of 21 or more. Students can receive a scholarship of \$1,000—\$3,000 per year, renewable for all 4 years as long as they maintain a QPA of 3.0 and pass at least 24 credits per year.

Some exceptional students may receive a full or partial tuition waiver. Students who qualify for our Honors Program may receive additional scholarships.



Endowed **Scholarships**

Students may be eligible for additional scholarships open to all Clarion University students. Some of these scholarships are automatically awarded by the admissions office, however some require an application.
