Instructional uses for ePortfolio

ePortfolios are a tool and learning process for deepening student learning. Consider the following use cases:

Paper Submissions

One way to utilize ePortfolio in a course is to have students take papers from their assignments folder and share them in ePortfolio with a group. This group will be able to comment and give peer reviews to the shared document.

Note: As the course instructor you must create a sharing group of entire class for students to share with as well as give permission to use turned in assignments and feedback in ePortfolio.

Upload Completed Projects

Students can upload and display completed projects, like videos, art pieces, or anything of that nature. They can then share their projects with students within their courses for peer review.

Create a Collection for a Research Project

Students can upload and create a collection for a research project for easy access and organization of information for a research project.

Subject Specific Examples

There are many ways to integrate usage of ePortfolio within a course. A few subject specific examples are as follows.

- Marketing and Management Using ePortfolio in your marketing and management courses allows student to demonstrate the highlights of their academic career.
- **English/Language** By using ePortfolio for a writing or language based course, professors can evaluate language proficiency, or provide a platform for peer review.
- **Art** Students can upload completed projects and write reflections that focus on technical resolve concept/interest, composition and technique in order to create a presentation in ePortfolio.
- **Communication** Students can upload complete projects, videos, or documentation to be shared with classmates for review or to be stored into a Professional portfolio to share with future employers.
